- supporting our Chaplains in Schools, Prisons, Missions to Seafarers and Aged Care
- Equipping Christians to be able to explain their faith if asked

How can we do these?

- Knowing and experiencing how much God loves us
- Explaining and emphasising what God is calling each and all of us to be and do
- Promoting and sharing good ideas and initiatives that are already working in different places
- Providing training in talking about our faith/apologetics
- Increasing the connections between our churches and Op Shops/Emergency Relief/Schools etc.
- Fostering the work of the Sustainable Living Working Party across our parishes
- Finding out more about the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, other relevant ethnic groups, disabled people and their carers (Luke 14).
- Fostering our links with Kapsabet and the Maori Diocese
